Dear Parents.....

The summer is here. With the arrival of summer this is my “pretty please” article. I ask all parents to “pretty please” take the opportunity to discuss the below letter with your children.

It is important that if your children are going to be on the club property unaccompanied, they need to be aware of the rules and expectations of the club. We truly believe the club to be an important part of the family culture and want to make sure it is a positive experience for everyone.

- Review rules and proper behavior expectations. Please read the pool rules together and make sure that they understand. Changes have been made over the past year and we want to make sure they are aware of them. No food can be brought into the fenced area. Drinks must be covered and purchased through the club.
- Make sure that no food and drinks are brought in the playground area. It is important that the children pick up their plates and trash and throw them in the garbage can as soon as they are finished. Leaving trash attracts bugs and bees that can be dangerous.
- Proper ticket signing with your children is important. Please ask your child to make sure they let those working in the Cabana and other areas know they are taking items. All food and beverage in the Cabana will be stored behind the counter and must be requested. At no time should children or members be in the kitchen area. Just a reminder that children under the age of 21 should not be in the men’s lounge/locker room of the main clubhouse unless with a parent.
- And lastly, the “Weapons with Weapons”, as best stated by Robert Weinerth, discuss the importance of proper usage of golf clubs and tennis rackets with small children. Hopefully, this can avoid a visit to the emergency room for stitches.
- Please make sure that all your child’s information is updated and on file at the pool and in the club business office. The club must have contact numbers, and know about any necessary medical condition and food allergies.

On The GREENS

According to the weatherman, we are still in a rainfall deficit for 2011. Since late February I guess we did have a period of 10-14 days where we started to get a little dry, but we've also had about 9" of rain over the past two months. Most of which has been fairly recent. To add to the fun we've had mostly windy days, half of which were 10-20mph days. We had some days with gusts over 40mph, and of course even higher gusts during recent storms.

In the last newsletter I said we hoped to finish installing timber curbing on 1, 2, and 3 in early March. Unfortunately the rain and storms have hampered our efforts. We spent about 25 labor hours working on one, but we've spent nearly 230 labor hours working on the unexpected. Most of which was storm cleanup. Some was an irrigation problem, which sometimes happens when you first pressurize the system in spring. Throw in equipment repairs and 15-20% of our time has been playing catch-up and cleanup. Anyone that's ever worked on or around a golf course knows that actually this sounds pretty normal.

The season is in full swing, hopefully now warmer weather will follow. The bermuda grass is coming alive. It just needs good weather. Our greens aeration will be Monday May, 9th. The greens should be growing well which should allow a quick recovery. Barring anymore set backs we will attempt to finish the timber curbing.

Thanks to Carol Deaton for organizing the Member Workday on March 12th. This time we had close to 15 volunteers working to care for the boxwood in the circle entrance to the club, as well as pruning along the hedge on 10, the landscaping at 11 tee, and around the Club and Cabana. I believe we are looking at a second workday in May as we prepare to open the pool and Cabana for the season. Anyone interested in helping can contact me, Ms. Benton, or Ms. Deaton.

Finally, no you are not seeing double if you thought you saw two swans on number 11. Thanks to Jinks Morris, we now have a female to mate with the lonely male swan. Since the week of April 3-10, I have been seeing her nesting on the island. Prior to the nesting I was seeing some very aggressive behavior from the male swan toward the geese that looked to be trying to gain a foothold on the island. Hopefully sometime around May 20th we could see our first baby swans.

Chicken and Broccoli Calzones

Dough: 3 cups all purpose flour, 1(.25oz) pkg active dry yeast, 2 tablespoons of vegetable oil, 1 teaspoon of salt, 1 tablespoon of granulated sugar, 1 cup of warm water (110 degrees). Combine flour, salt, yeast, sugar in a large bowl. Mix in half the oil, warm water. After mixing 2 to 3 minutes remove from bowl, Sprinkling a little flour on your surface and shape the dough in four 8 inch rounds, set dough and refrigerate while you put the stuffing together.

Stuffing: 12oz grated mozzarella, 1.5 lb cooked chicken diced, 2 cups of broccoli cool and combine. Pull out your dough, top half of each round with your stuffing fold the dough over and pinch the edges to seal. Place on a baking sheet and brush with the remaining oil. Bake until brown 25 to 30 minutes. Serve with Marinara.

Frequently Asked Questions

When the check is presented to the table is the service charge and sales tax on the check?

For all food and beverage charges the club will add 18% service charge and 9% sales tax. After the member signs the ticket the ticket is turned into the business office for entry into the computer. At the time it is entered into the computer, the 18% service charge and 5% state tax and 4% meal tax is added to the check. Your monthly statement will show the total food and beverage charge with the additional sales taxes and service charges, but the check presented at the table will not.
